

## Lodge By-Laws

I. Statemert of purpose
A. Our purposes are to:

1. Live according to our holistic spinitual beliefs, honoring the duality of creation in balance with natural world.
2. Grow and educate ourselves in our spinitual beliets.
3. Encourage and support our brothers and sisters of the lodge in all possible aims, including the Iending of our joined energy to members in times of need.
4. Gather for the 8 seasonal celebrations, 13 moons and lodge meєtings, work medicine and recogrize growth.
5. Encourage one arother spinitually to live in accordance with our own personal $\epsilon$ †hics.
6. Share wisdom and knowledge operly with the lodge.
B. Comonitment

All members of this lodge nust have fully comuntted themselves to the above purpose in their beliefs, their activities and their lives.
II. Membership

## A. Qualifications

Individuals who wish to seek membership nust first subnit an application. Once the application has been reviewed, an interview with the applicant will be scheduled.
B. Degrees of Membership

1. Members - Dedicants and inifiates alike are considered to be members.
2. Lodge Council - All initiated members of the lodge are given membership within the lodge council. Initiated members are those who are First Degree initiates, priestess/priest, or high-priestess/high-priest. Dedicants are no才 considered inítiađed menters.

## C. Membership Status

Ary persor's membership may be curtailed, suspended, or terminated by decision of the Lodge Council either for lack of a††endance or parłicipaたion, or in violation of privacy agreements/secrecy vows.
III. Admúnistration and Operations
A. Body of Members

This body hardles the ordinary business of the lodge.

1. Membership - All those who have been initiated into the lodge are included in this body.
2. Scope - The membership discusses all mat卂ers of plaming, activities, initiations and poФєntial memberships.
3. Facilitation - The High-Priestess shall ordinarily chair meetings of the membership. Where she is absent, or chooses not to delegate this responsibility, a High-Priest shall chair the meєting.
4. Method of Operation - All decisions in the lodge are made by consersus. When consernsus cannot be reached, the members may refer the decision to the High-Priestess, who shall consider what has beer discussed and make the decision.
5. Meetings - Meetings for the lodge members occur when deemed necessary or desirable.
B. Lodge courcil

This body handles specific occumences and problems.

1. Membership - The Lodge Council consists of all initiated members of the lodge. Dedicants ane not official members of the Lodge Council.
2. Scope - The council discusses situations such as violations of the privacy of members, or disagreements within the lodge that my need to be moderated.
3. Meєtings - Lodge Council meєtings ane called on an as neєded basis.

## C. Guidelines for Conduct

All members shall keep in muind their devotion to their own ethical codes of conduct, as well as the lodge privacy and secrecy concems.
IV. Meeting Schedule
A. Rituals

1. Meeting will nomally be held on the evening of the full moon or Hew Moor when possible.
2. The 8 main seasonal celebrations shall nomally be held on their actual date whenever possible or as detemuined by the members.
3. Rituals are held by default at the Lodge itself, except in the onset of inclement weather which prevents such, then arother location will be sought.

## B. Classes

The lodge may or may not hold formal teaching classes. White we are constantly leaming and teaching one another, hands-on experience is our most powerful teacher, and each member is responsible for attaining the Ievel of knowledge that they seek.
V. А円†еrdance
A. Meetings are open to all members, save for Lodge Council gatherings, where only initiated members are invited, by default.
B. Initiations are open to inifiated members onty.
C. the Lodge is HOT a Public Lodge; rituals and meєtings are not oper to the public/guests.
D. Members are expected to participate in meєtings, celebrations, rituals. If any member attends fewer than 75\% of these events, their status may be subject to review by the Lodge Council.
VI. Privacy of Members
A. The names, addresses, telephone numbers and other information relating to individual members shall no币 be disclosed to nonmembers without the permission of the individual involved.
B. Disclosure of confidential information may be considered a violation of secrecy and grounds for expulsion from the Lodge.
